4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

Inhalation	Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Call a physician if symptoms develop or persist.

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable extinguishing media	Foam. Dry powder. Carbon dioxide (CO2). Water fog.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE
